## Major Pentascales (5-note scales)

H = Half step (to the next black or white key)W = Whole step (skip one key, counting black and white keys)

Pentascale Pattern: W W H W

Use the above pattern to find the rest of the 5 notes above the first note. Below are all of the pentascales spelled out.

Each pentascale has a chord. The chord is the 1<sup>st</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, and 5<sup>th</sup> note of the pentascale. Use fingers 1, 3, and 5 to play the chord.

Minor pentascales and chords: Lower the 3<sup>rd</sup> a half step.

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
